Marjorie BERTHOMIER



Marjorie BERTHOMIER is Deputy Secretary General of the Franco-German University (UFA), since February 2017.

Lecturer at the University of Paris Descartes since 2000 and university attaché at the French Embassy in Germany from 2006 to 2010, Marjorie Berthomier was responsible for bilateral cooperation and exchange programs between France and Germany, in partnership with the DAAD and the UFA. In 2011, she became director of the French Institute in Leipzig before returning to the French Embassy in Berlin in 2013 as cultural attaché, more specifically in charge of artistic cooperation, heritage, and issues related to digitization in the cultural sector and creative industries.

Carle BONAFOUS-MURAT



Carle Bonafous-Murat was president of the University of Paris 3 Sorbonne-Nouvelle from December 2014 to December 2018. He has also been a member of the board of directors of the Conference of the University Presidents (CPU) since June, 2016.

As a former student of the École normale supérieure de Fontenay-aux-Roses, he completed part of his studies, from the master's to the doctorate, at the Sorbonne-Nouvelle, where he defended his habilitation to direct research.

Professor of Irish literature in the Department of Anglophone Studies at the University of Paris 3 Sorbonne-Nouvelle, and responsible for the Master's degree in Irish studies, he had previously taught at the universities of Lyon 2 and Maine. In these two universities, and then at the Sorbonne-Nouvelle, he held various positions, as deputy director of a department, director of a doctoral school, then vice-president of the board of directors and vice-president of the research commission.

Raimund FEIFEL



Raimund Feifel has been a professor of experimental atomic and molecular physics at the University of Gothenburg since 2013.

After a PhD in 2003 at Uppsala University (UU), Raimund was a postdoctoral Research Fellow in Physical Chemistry at Oxford University. He returned to UU in 2007 and became a senior lecturer and professor of Physics in the department of Physics and Astronomy in 2011.

Mathieu GABORIT



Mathieu Gaborit did his PhD between the LAUM UMR CNRS 6613 in Le Mans, France and the Marcus Wallenberg Laboratory at KTH in Stockholm, Sweden. He defended his thesis titled "Modelling strategies for imperfect interfaces and layers" in December 2019 after 3 years working on the acoustics and uncertainties in poroelastic media (for instance open-cell foams). Mathieu is now a post-doc researcher at the ECO2 Centre for Economical and Ecological Vehicle design at KTH and works on the physical description of Kelvin-Cell packings as idealised foams and their optimisation for mechanical constraints.

Beatrice SVEDBERG

Beatrice Svedberg Future Competence Strategist at Scania. She has a MSC in Chemical Engineering from Umeå Univeristy. She has been working as a design engineer at Volvo Cars before joining Scania in 2008.

Since 2012, she has been working with Scania's competence strategies in cooperation with academic partners.

From her international experiences, she has learned a lot about different cultures, an early understanding of environmental problems in South East Asia and the urge to solve environmental issues has been the key motivator in all decisions about education and career.
